Which standards will my child be measured on?

- For each grade level, specific learning targets have been established. The standards determined for the grade level are called <u>Power</u> <u>Standards</u>.
- The smaller increments of skills, knowledge and understanding to reach the Power Standards are called <u>Learning Targets</u>.

Not all targets will be assessed at the beginning of the year.

Calculating Grades 2017-18 at PK-5

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Teachers score assessment/projects/quizzes to determine mastery of a learning target using a 4 point scale.

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Scales have 4-3-2-1
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Academic Descriptors

Score 4

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- Learning and performing beyond grade-level standards. **Score 3**
 - Meeting grade-level standards; independently; thoroughly; and accurately.

Score 2

• Progressing toward grade-level standards with some additional help and support.

Score 1

• Limited understanding and experiencing difficulty meeting required grade-level standards; consistently requiring assistance.

Calculating Grades- Continued

• When determining the final score for the Learning Target we will <u>no</u> longer use the Power Law grade calculation.

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 Final scores will be determined by using a weighted average. The two most recent scores will be weighted using a 25%-75% model.

This method of calculating grades continues to place emphasis on the most recent assessment in a more straight-forward and easy to understand manner.

Calculating Grades- An Example

Sally Sample's Math Scores on the 3rd Grade Fraction Learning Target:

DateAssignment9/15Equiv Fractions CheckUp 39/28Equiv Fractions Post-Test 4

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<u>Score</u> 2.0 3.0 <u>Weight Used</u> 25% 75%

Total Score= 2.75* using the weighted average

*If additional assessments are added during the year, the oldest assessment will roll off and not be used in the scoring calculation. Only the last two scores will be used under each Learning Target to calculate the LT score.
